TECH INSPECTION

Your team SFI tech inspector is responsible for teching your vehicle before bringing your tech card to the MEDIA CENTER located in the pit area for registration. **Be sure it is filled out completely and signed by both you and your SFI tech inspector.** If you have had an ETI on your vehicle, bring your ETI card and tech card to racer registration. If your team SFI tech inspector is not available, you may have any of the other track SFI inspector's tech your vehicle.

RUN CARDS

To obtain your run card please take your completed tech card along with your NHRA competition number/license and NHRA membership to the Media Center in the middle of the pit area, and turn them in to the registration staff. They will issue your run card. You are now ready to race.

TOWER ACCESS

If you have a problem and need help from the tower, have your Team Captain come to the tower with you. Racers are not allowed in the tower without a Team Captain.

DIAL-INS

All dial-ins must be on the RIGHT SIDE OR REAR OF THE VEHICLE PRIOR TO REACHING THE CROSS OVER BRIDGE behind the tower. Once you reach this line there is no changing of dial-ins. Dial in boards must be mounted to the vehicle and visible to the tower and track crew at all times. If your number and dial-in are not visible and permanently attached to you vehicle, your team will NOT RECEIVE POINTS.

LANE CHOICE

Lane choice will be designated by the staging director, who will direct you to your given lane.

STAGING

There is no deep staging allowed. Courtesy staging is in effect. Both drivers should pre-stage before either stages. The starter has the final decision on the starting line.

CONTINGENCY DECALS

Contingency decals will be available on Friday morning at the NHRA Division 4 trailer. Bring your run card. It is the responsibility of the racer to have and display the contingency decals. We do not have all posting sponsor decals and supplies are limited.

TEAM RULES

1. Each team to consist of 50 vehicles; one team per track.
2. Teams will receive one free entry for every 10 paid entries (rebated after the event by Texas Motorplex).
3. **One driver may drive the same vehicle in 2 classes (limited to Super Pro and No Box)**
4. Vehicle may participate on only one team.
5. Team members may participate on only one team.
6. Alternates may only be listed on one team roster.
7. Each team is required to have a Team Captain as its spokesperson to race officials.
8. Each team is required to have all team vehicles inspected by an SFI-approved technical inspector. An SFI-inspector from another team may inspect vehicles. (NHRA Certification Team will be on hand for spot inspection to verify compliance).
9. All participants must have an NHRA competition license (6.39 and quicker) and a competition number.
10. All participants must be NHRA Members.
11. **Race of Champions, JR Street, and High School participants will not be included in team points.**
12. ROC entries for Super Pro, No Box and Motorcycle must be on the teams 50 member roster.
13. Drivers must have competed in the NHRA Summit ET Racing Series program at their team track during the current year at a minimum of two separate events (**NO EXCEPTIONS**).
14. All team members must be on their team's pre-entry list prior to arriving at the race.
15. Motorcycle will be an all-run field; they may be included in the track team points.
16. Motorcycle Race of Champions entries must be listed on the tracks team roster of 50 points earning participants.
17. Team parking at the event will be determined by previous year's finish, with the best parking going to the top finishing teams.
18. Dial in boards must be mounted to the vehicle and visible to the tower at track crew at all times.
19. Team pictures will be taken Saturday at 3 pm in the water box.
20. Representing a track at which you did not compete twice during the year will be cause for disqualification from event and loss of team spot.
21. Sessions will be conducted Friday and Saturday by class.
22. Any team protests must be filed by the team captain, with the event director by noon Saturday.
23. Team lane assignments will be drawn Friday night.
24. Bye runs: 1st round bye run will be based on the final time trial in each class and go to the racer with the best reaction time. Tie will go to the first racer who does it first.
25. Bye runs: 2nd round bye runs will be determined buy the best winning reaction time from 1st round. If there is a tie, the first racer to have the reaction will receive the bye run. Bye runs will carry over starting 2nd rd. until the racer either loses or is awarded the bye run.
26. High School competitors will be eligible for their team as long as the team does not exceed its limit of 50.
27. All competitors **under 18 years of age** must have an NHRA Minor Release form on file at event.
28. No time trials Sunday morning.
29. All rule interpretations will be handled by the event director.
30. To replace a driver with an **ALTERNATE DRIVER** they must be on either the *team roster* or on the *alternate roster* that was submitted to Texas Motorplex prior to the event. There will be no exceptions! An ALTERNATE DRIVER must have a current NHRA E.T number and NHRA Membership, and the **ALTERNATE DRIVER** can drive their own race vehicle after it passes tech inspection. Teams limited to a maximum of 10 Alternates.
31. Alternate's Bracket Race first round will be run after all first rounds have been run. Electronics and No Box run separate.
32. **YOU MUST HAVE A DRIVER'S LICENSE TO OPERATE GOLF CARTS OR MOTORIZED VEHICLES ON THE PROPERTY. Anyone without a license found driving a vehicle will be cause for disqualification for the vehicle's owner/race team.**



SPORTSMAN MOTORCYCLE RACERS

1. The ET Finals program at the NHRA Summit Racing Series Finals is open to all motorcycle racers who have participated at a minimum of two ET points events at an *NHRA South Central Division Member Track within the competition year.*
2. All participants must have an NHRA competition license (6.39 and quicker) and/or a competition number (6.39 and slower).
3. All participants must be an NHRA member.
4. Winner will receive a NHRA Gold Card, Jacket, and a *Wally* trophy at the NHRA Division Champion's Banquet.

SPORTSMAN and HIGH SCHOOL RULES

1. Follows Pomona NHRA rules below.

No-BOX\Pro (Pro National Championship Rules)

1. Computer: Prohibited unless stock OEM equipment. See general regulations 9:1.
2. Data Recorders: Prohibited. See general regulations 9:2 & 9:10.
3. Delay Boxes: Prohibited.
4. Transbrake: Permitted.
5. Line lock: Four-wheel line lock permitted.
6. Automated Shifter: Permitted.
7. Throttle Control: Throttle must be manually operated by the drivers. Electronics, pneumatics, hydraulics or any other device may in no way affect the throttle operation. A dead stop under the carburetor or gas pedal is permitted. Throttle timers, counters prohibited.
8. Ignition: Stutter boxes prohibited. Starting line and or 'high side' rev limiters permitted. Two steps, rev limiters or any other rpm limiting devices, legal unto themselves but altered or installed so as to function as a down-track rpm controller, prohibited.
9. Switches & Buttons: All switches and/or buttons must be NHRA accepted standard mechanical connection type. Infrared lasers, retinal scan, fingerprint, light source or other non-mechanical type switch prohibited.
10. Tow vehicles: Prohibited.

HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

1. Only one High School entry per team.
2. Competitor must have been enrolled in high school during the 2017 school-year.
3. Entry to the High School program is free.
4. All vehicles must run DOT-approved street tires.
5. No vehicles quicker than 8.20 seconds are allowed.
6. All vehicles must have muffler (hooked up).
7. No electronics (throttle stops, transbrakes, etc.).
8. All vehicles must have current license tags.
9. Competitor must have an NHRA competition number and NHRA membership.
10. All competitors **under 18 years of age** must have NHRA Minor Release form on file.

Winner will receive a \$250 Summit gift certificate, Jacket, and a *Wally* Trophy at the NHRA Division Champion's Banquet. **Gold Cards will not be awarded to the winner of the High School Race.**

SUMMIT SHOWDOWN RACE OF CHAMPIONS

1. 1 racer from each participating track allowed in each class: Super Pro, No Box\Pro, and Motorcycle.
2. Ladder will be set from Track Drawing for positions.
3. Classes will be: Super Pro, No Box\Pro, and Motorcycle.
4. Racer must be listed on pre-entry list prior to event.
5. Winners will receive NHRA Gold Card, Jacket, and a *Wally* Trophy at the NHRA Division Champion's Banquet.

JR. STREET RACE OF CHAMPIONS-One entry per track, all Jr. Street rules will be enforced.

7. All vehicles must have current license tags.

2017 NHRA SUMMIT RACING SERIES NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GUIDELINES

SUPER PRO ET (1/4 mile 7.00 – 11.99)

1. Computer: Prohibited unless stock OEM equipment. See general regulations 9:1.
2. Data Recorders: Permitted. See general regulations 9:2 & 9:10.
3. Delay Boxes: Permitted. One box/device only attached to transbrake and/or throttle timer only. Refer to 2017 NHRA Rulebook. All wiring must be clearly identifiable for inspection.
4. Transbrake: Permitted.
5. Line lock: Four-wheel line lock permitted.
6. Automated Shifter: Permitted.
7. Throttle Control: Permitted per NHRA rulebook.
8. Ignition: Stutter boxes prohibited. Starting line and or 'high side' rev limiters permitted. Two-steps, rev-limiters or any other rpm limiting devices, legal unto themselves but altered or installed so as to function as a down-track rpm controller, prohibited.
9. Switches & Buttons: All switches and/or buttons must be NHRA accepted standard mechanical connection type. Infrared lasers, retinal scan, fingerprint, light source or other non-mechanical type switch prohibited.

PRO ET (1/4 mile 9.00 – 13.99)

11. Computer: Prohibited unless stock OEM equipment. See general regulations 9:1.
12. Data Recorders: Prohibited. See general regulations 9:2 & 9:10.
13. Delay Boxes: Prohibited.
14. Transbrake: Permitted.
15. Line lock: Four-wheel line lock permitted.
16. Automated Shifter: Permitted.
17. Throttle Control: Throttle must be manually operated by the drivers. Electronics, pneumatics, hydraulics or any other device may in no way affect the throttle operation. A deadstop under the carburetor or gas pedal is permitted. Throttle timers, counters prohibited.
18. Ignition: Stutter boxes prohibited. Starting line and or 'high side' rev limiters permitted. Two-steps, rev limiters or any other rpm limiting devices, legal unto themselves but altered or installed so as to function as a down-track rpm controller, prohibited.
19. Switches & Buttons: All switches and/or buttons must be NHRA accepted standard mechanical connection type. Infrared lasers, retinal scan, fingerprint, light source or other non-mechanical type switch prohibited.
20. Tow vehicles: Prohibited.

SPORTSMAN ET (1/4 mile 12.00 – 19.99)

1. Computer: Prohibited unless stock OEM equipment. See general regulations 9:1.
2. Data Recorders: Prohibited. See general regulations 9:2 & 9:10.
3. Delay Boxes: Prohibited.
4. Transbrake: Prohibited.
5. Line lock: Four-wheel line lock prohibited. Two-wheel line lock permitted on non-drive wheels only.
6. Automated Shifter: Prohibited unless OEM equipped.
7. Throttle Control: Throttle must be manually operated by the driver's foot. Electronics, pneumatics, hydraulics or any other device may in no way affect the throttle operation. A deadstop under the carburetor or gas pedal is permitted. Throttle timers, counters prohibited.
8. Ignition: Stutter boxes prohibited. Single stage (high side only) rev limiters permitted. Starting line rev limiter prohibited. Two or more step rev limiter prohibited, any other rpm limiting devices, legal unto themselves but altered or installed in so as to function as a down-track rpm controller prohibited. Crank trigger system prohibited, unless OEM distributorless ignition.
9. Switches & Buttons: All switches and/or buttons must be NHRA accepted standard mechanical connection type. Infrared lasers, retinal scan, fingerprint, light source or other non-mechanical type switch prohibited.
10. Tow vehicles: Prohibited.
11. Exhaust: Muffler(s) required.

SUPER PRO BIKE ET (1/4 mile 7.50 – 15.99)

Same electronic rules as Super Pro cars applies to motorcycles.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Drivers competing in NHRA Summit Racing Series competition at NHRA Mello Yello Drag Racing Series events will be required to be 16 years of age or older.
2. A competitor entered in the Summit Racing Series National Championship may not compete in any other category at the event except for another Summit Racing Series National Championship category, but cannot use the same car in both categories.
3. Should the Division Champion be unable to attend, contact the respective Division office for alternate policy.

Refer to the 2017 NHRA Rulebook for all applicable safety requirements in each ET Bracket.



Summit Racing Series National Championship Drawing Held in Norwalk

In a special drawing for the NHRA Summit Racing Series National Championship, four NHRA Divisions were selected to send an extra racer to compete for the national championship at the season ending Automobile Club NHRA Finals at Auto Club Raceway at Pomona.

Summit Racing Equipment Pro Stock drivers Greg Anderson and Jason Line joined Summit's Jim Greenleaf and Don Lower along with NHRA Division Director Jeff Conley for the prerace ceremonies drawing at today's Summit Racing Equipment NHRA Nationals at Summit Motorsports Park.

The Northwest Division 6 was drawn for Super Pro, Southeast Division 2 for Pro, the Pacific Division 7 for Sportsman, and the Northeast Division 1 for Motorcycle. Each will bring the eighth man that will complete the 8-car field. For Divisions 2 and 1 their Summit Division Finals Race of Champions winner will fill the eighth spot while Divisions 6 and 7 will bring their event champion for the final spot.

The first seven racers in each class are made up of the NHRA Summit Racing Series Division Finals champions in each of the NHRA divisions 1 through 5, divisions 6 and 7 send their Race of Champions winner to the national championship competition.
